**Seymour Papert is chairing the Tenth International Conference on Technology in Education (Cambridge, MA). The dates are: March 21-24, 1993.**

The overarching theme of the conference is rethinking the role of computers (and all computational media) in education. The opposition of instruction and construction is meant to be a starting point for broad ranging thinking about the variety of roles technology is playing or could play in learning. Gary Stager, Ihor Charischak, and Michael Tempel will be presenting at this conference.
